Cascades East AHEC Nursing Education Project Takes Off

A cohort of 18 students began classes in a new distance nursing education program in June. It is a creative opportunity that increases COCC nursing education capacity, aims to improve nursing shortages (especially in rural Oregon) and access to nursing education in rural areas. This project is a collaborative effort by Cascades East AHEC (CEAHEC), Central Oregon Community College (COCC), and six Central Oregon Hospital Network Hospitals. For nearly two years, the project team has been working for to create a distance model for nursing education. Students will complete much of the course work and clinical experience in their home hospitals. COCC selected hospital employed preceptors in each location to provide clinical training for students under the oversight of traveling faculty. Eighteen employees of the six hospitals were selected to participate in the first class. This exciting nursing education opportunity is the first of its kind in Oregon. Students will graduate in December 2005.
