### *“Lipids: The Good, The Bad and The Unknown”*

John Tayek, MD, Professor of Medicine, Dept of Medicine; Director of Community Health Plan, University of California, Los Angeles; School of Medicine, Harbor-UCLA Medical Center.

*Objectives:* 1) Describe the relationship between LDL cholesterol and primary and secondary prevention of CAD. 2) Discuss the potential role of lipid soluble statins (atorvastatin, simvastatin) as compared to non lipid soluble statins (pravastatin, rosuvastatin) for treatment of CHF. 3) Discuss the effects of statin treatment with regards to reduction in plaque volume in patients with CAD. 4) Discuss dietary factors that may help lower LDL cholesterol to goal and raise the HDL to goal. 5) Describe the risk of rhabdomyolysis with the use of lipid soluble statin and any other 3A4 medications (“A Slaved Liver”). 6) Discuss the issues related to the paradoxical results of the ENHANCE Trial.
