Pain Management Education for Physicians and other healthcare providers:

As a result of Senate Bill 885, the Oregon Board of Medical Examiners requires a one-hour pain management course specific to Oregon provided by the Pain Management Commission of the Department of Human Services; and a minimum of 6 (six) credit hours in the subjects of pain management and/or the treatment of terminally ill and dying patients.

The required CME must be completed after January 1, 2000 and before January 2, 2009 for current licensees (*Administrative Rule 847-010-0100*). To fulfill the one-hour course specific to Oregon, go to: www.oregonpain.org
